Courses available on videocassette to view at your convenience

Telecourses provide a convenient, flexible way to earn college credits in the comfort of your home. You can choose to set your own study schedule with lessons available on videocassette tapes or watch lessons on cable television. Telecourses include weekly assignments, textbook and study guide readings, and easy access to instructors by phone or e-mail. Convenient exam schedules are a plus for busy students juggling job and family responsibilities. Some courses may require on-campus class sessions. The telecourse fee, not included in course tuition, is listed in the body of the course schedule. For more information, call or e-mail the campus nearest you.

ONLINE COURSES

Access expanded offerings right from your home!

Delaware Tech online courses are a learning option for independent, self-motivated students. They are for students who have little time to come on campus for courses or who have travel constraints. They are of the same quality and rigor as on-campus courses. They are most appropriate for you if you are self-directed and have at least moderate computer skills. You will need access to a computer and an Internet provider. Suggested minimum hardware/software requirements are a 56 bps modem, Pentium II processor, 32 megs of RAM, standard version of a word processor, up-to-date virus protection program, and course software. Students are responsible for having all the required hardware/software prior to class.

Online courses are instructor-led courses (not self-paced), delivered entirely in a password-protected, Web-based format. They include a course Web page, instructor and student e-mail, and discussion sessions. Instructors post the course work, including assignments, to the course Web page. Students participate in electronic discussions and complete assignments. Testing is offered online or at approved sites.

Students can access their courses through MyDTCC, using their college e-mail user-name and password. All OAT and CIS students should verify hardware/software requirements with their instructors prior to registration.
