Parking Permit: All students, faculty and staff must obtain a free Parking Permit for the current school year. The permit allows you access to our parking lots on a first-come, first-served basis (Sept. 1 - Aug. 31).

TUITION/FEE ADJUSTMENT POLICY

Course or Semester Withdrawal: To receive an adjustment for a course withdrawal, the student must first officially withdraw from the course. To receive an adjustment for a semester withdrawal, the student must first officially withdraw from all courses. Course or semester withdrawals received prior to the first day of the semester will be adjusted at 100% of the course cost of tuition plus any related refundable fees (lab, technology support, and distance learning). For an official course or semester withdrawal processed during the official drop/add period, the student will be charged 25% of the tuition for each course withdrawn, not to exceed the full-time tuition rate, and 25% of any related refundable fees for the course(s) withdrawn. All non-refundable fees (application, registration, late registration, student services, credit by examination, and evaluation of work experience) will be retained by the College. The official drop/add period for each semester and each session within that semester will be identified on the Academic Calendar. After the official drop/add period, no tuition/fee adjustment will be made. Students are responsible for 100% of tuition and fees. The processing of refunds will begin June 2, 2010 for Summer Session 2010, and September 8, 2010 for Fall Semester 2010.

Class Cancellation: Courses may be cancelled for lack of enrollment, in which case enrollees may receive full refunds or select another course. To obtain a refund, or add a different course, a student must fill out a drop/add form and submit it to the Registrar's Office.

Drop/Add: To drop/add a course, students must obtain forms from their counselor, advisor or the Registrar's Office.

Deferred Payment Plan: If total tuition exceeds \$175 you may use the Deferred Payment Plan. One-third of the total tuition and course fees, or \$175, whichever is greater, is due at registration. Refer to your schedule/bill for the second and third payment due dates.

HOPE Scholarship/Lifetime Learning

Educational Tax Credits: The HOPE Scholarship/Lifetime Learning Educational Tax Credits are options to help offset educational costs. Technically, the HOPE "Scholarship" is not a scholarship. It is a tax credit available to eligible students. Delaware Tech does not determine if students are eligible for this tax credit. It is recommended that your tax advisor be consulted for more details. For complete details concerning eligibility, etc., consult your tax advisor, or visit the IRS Website (www.irs.gov).

Senior Citizens Tuition Waiver: Residents of the State of Delaware who are 60 years of age or older may enroll at Delaware Tech, tuition free, in any catalog course: technical or related studies, day or evening. Delaware Tech/University of Delaware Associate in Arts Degree Program credit courses are also included. Excluded are special interest (non-credit) courses. Persons eligible for this privilege are not required to pay application, course registration or other related fees. They shall pay the cost of all books, supplies, laboratory and technology support fees. This privilege may be limited or denied in courses for which selective admissions criteria have been established. This privilege is granted on a space available basis if such courses are not filled at the close of registration.

Quick & Convenient: Use your MasterCard, VISA or Discover when you register.

Veterans' Affairs: Monthly education and training allowances are provided under provisions of the Veterans' Administration. A veteran of military service, qualified reservist, or a qualified dependent may be eligible for assistance. For more information contact the Veterans' Office.
