

## The Top Ten Questions Asked about Spring Break Camp

### 1. Does the camp day include an extended care program?

The extended care program begins at 7:30 a.m. and ends at 6 p.m. The fee is \$30 for the week.

### 2. Will I be able to bring my own equipment?

The camp will provide all the equipment you will need.

### 3. Do I need to bring my lunch?

Yes, you will need to bring a lunch, and Delaware Tech will provide refrigeration. Snacks and lunch can also be purchased at our bookstore and cafeteria.

### 4. How should I dress for camp?

Come dressed to participate in athletic and artistic activities.

### 5. Who works on the Spring Break Camp staff?

Our staff is composed of counselors, teachers and college students from the local area.

### 6. Do I need to make a deposit to register?

Yes, a deposit of \$50 per child is due with your application.

### 7. What is the counselor/camper ratio?

State guidelines for counselor/camper ratio are followed. Therefore, 9- to 12-year-olds will have a 1/10 ratio; 7- to 8-year-olds will have a 1/9 ratio; and 5- to 6-year-olds will have a 1/5 ratio.

### 8. Will there be any additional fees?

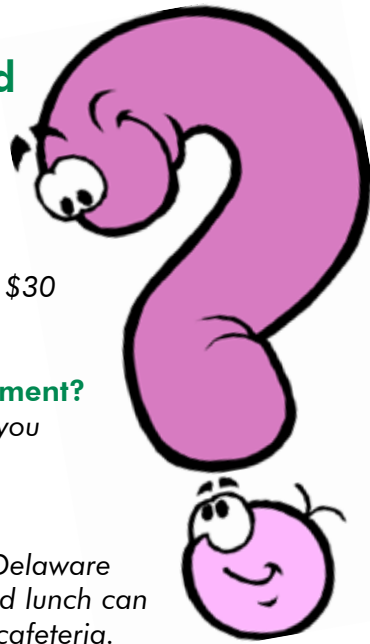
Only if you utilize the extended care program.

### 9. When should I register for camp?

Please register at least one month prior to the start of camp.

### 10. Can I make a reservation today?

Yes. Your deposit is due with your application.



## What to bring:

**Lunch:** Each camper will need to bring a lunch, snack and drink. Refrigeration will be provided.

**Athletic wear:** Each camper will be participating in athletics and may want to bring sneakers and a hat for outdoor activities.

**Sunscreen:** Outdoor activities are scheduled regularly. Please bring a hat and/or sunscreen for your child.

## Policies:

**Sign-In/Sign-Out:** All campers must be escorted by parents or guardians into the main lobby and signed in with our camp staff between 8:45 and 9 a.m. Late arrivals should check in at the CCP office. Any camper arriving before 8:45 a.m. and/or not picked up by 4 p.m. will be assigned to our extended day program and a fee of \$10 per child will be due at the time of drop-off and/or pick-up.

**Early Dismissal:** If a camper needs to leave early, please send a note stating the time of departure and who will be responsible for camper sign out. The person responsible for picking up the camper will need to report to the camp staff and may be asked to provide identification. Anyone not providing identification will not be permitted to take the camper off the grounds until a parent is contacted by telephone. Due to the nature of our field trips, we cannot allow pick ups during field trips. Pick up must be done by 12:30 pm on field trip days.

**Medicine:** All medications need to be given to the camp coordinator upon arrival. A Medication Form which authorizes staff to administer medication must be completed. If you are bringing medications to camp for your child, please make sure that they are clearly labeled. All prescription medications must be in original pharmacy containers labeled with name of patient, date prescription was filled, pharmacy phone number, name of medication, dosage, and schedule for taking, prescribing doctor and expiration date of medicine. Count the number of tablets (unless the number is the exact number on the label) or approximate amount of liquid in the bottle.

**Cancellations/Refunds:** Refund: Deposits are non-refundable. If your child is unable to attend a camp in which he/she HAS enrolled, you may request a refund for the remaining balance paid from Corporate and Community Programs. All requests must be received in writing via us mail, fax or email. For partial refund requests to be considered, you must speak to camp office representatives only. Please note that refunds for payments made by check may take a minimum of six weeks to process.

**Transfer Policy:** If your child is unable to attend a camp in which he/she is enrolled, you may request a transfer to another camp week within the same camp season. All requests must be received in writing via us mail, fax or email and must be received 72 hours prior to the first day of the camp week for which your child is enrolled. Any camp transfer which may occur will not be considered for partial refund at a later date.
