A certified pharmacy technician (CPhT) must demonstrate an awareness of abilities and limitations in providing pharmaceutical services, the ability to relate to people, and the capacity to understand the patient's needs. The Pharmacy Technician Training Program will prepare you to perform the duties of a pharmacy technician in both retail and hospital settings.

REQUIREMENTS/ PREREQUISITES:

- Must be at least 18 years old

- Be certified in CPR for healthcare providers
- Complete a criminal background check with negative results
- Complete a drug screening test with negative results
- Complete a PPD skin test for tuberculosis with negative results
- Complete a physical examination
- Complete a math assessment (given the first night of class)
- Basic computer skills
