DENTAL HYGIENE

Delaware Tech operates on a semester system with new terms beginning in late August and mid-January, plus summer terms beginning at the end of May and in mid-June. Non-technology courses may be taken on a part-time or full-time basis during any semester or the summer term. Some students may need refresher courses at the basic or pre-tech level; others may receive transfer credit for prior educational experiences or credit for work experience. Dental Hygiene Technology is available to students meeting the minimum admission criteria through a competitive selection process. Technology courses are open only to those students who have been selected to enter the technology. These courses are sequential and are offered only one time per year.

Dental Hygiene Technology Terry/Owens Extension is an extension location of the Wilmington Campus Dental Hygiene Program. **It is available to students residing in Kent and Sussex counties** who have been selected to enter the technology. These courses are sequential and are offered only one time per year.

People interested in entering Dental Hygiene Terry/Owens extension must make an appointment to meet with the Dental Hygiene Advisor on the Owens Campus at 302-856-5400, Ext. 2890. February 1st deadline to apply for the Clinical Program.

HOW TO BEGIN –

1. Obtain, complete, and submit an Application for Admission with a \$10 non-refundable fee to the Admissions Office. Make check payable to Delaware Technical & Community College. Applications are available via the Web (www.dtcc.edu/admissions), by phone or mail, or from a high school counselor.
2. Develop a financial plan to identify resources, such as financial aid, SEED, and other scholarships, to help pay for college.
3. Request that your official high school, GED, and/or college transcript be sent immediately to the Admissions Office.
4. Participate in the college testing and placement program, if required. Official scores from SAT/ACT tests or previous college credit may satisfy this requirement.
5. Meet for advisement to begin an educational plan and select courses for registration.
