

# Advisement Assistance for Health Career Studies Students

Health Career Studies students pursuing an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in nursing should consider the following when registering for courses:

## To be eligible to register for and to take the NLN Pre-Admission Exam, these courses need to have been completed:

- **All pre-tech courses** (ENG 005; ENG 051; RDG 005 RDG 051; MAT 012)
- **Chemistry**

To receive credit for chemistry when registering to take the NLN Pre-Admission Exam, the student must have either taken and passed with a C (not a C-) high school chemistry within the last five years **or** college level chemistry (CHM 100 or CHM 110 at DTCC) within the last 10 years. Chemistry may be evaluated for transfer from another college if the student completed the chemistry course within the last five years (effective 5/08).

- **RDG 120** – Critical Reading and Thinking (3 cr.)

The Associate Degree Nursing Program at Stanton is oversubscribed; therefore, students compete for clinical seats each year. Students are ranked in March for acceptance into the nursing program the following January and August. All students planning on entering nursing courses must take the required general education courses. Points are assigned for ranking based on the student's NLN Pre-Admission Exam score and on courses successfully completed. More points for ranking are awarded for higher grades in the science courses: BIO 120; BIO 121; BIO 125.
