Tuition

In-state tuition day/evening is \$97.50 per credit hour. Maximum tuition for full-time students—\$1,170.00 per semester, 12 credits or more.

Out-of-state tuition is \$243.75 per credit hour. Maximum tuition for full-time students—\$2,925.00 per semester, 12 credits or more.

Students registered for 12 credit hours per semester or the equivalent are considered full-time for purposes of tuition payments.

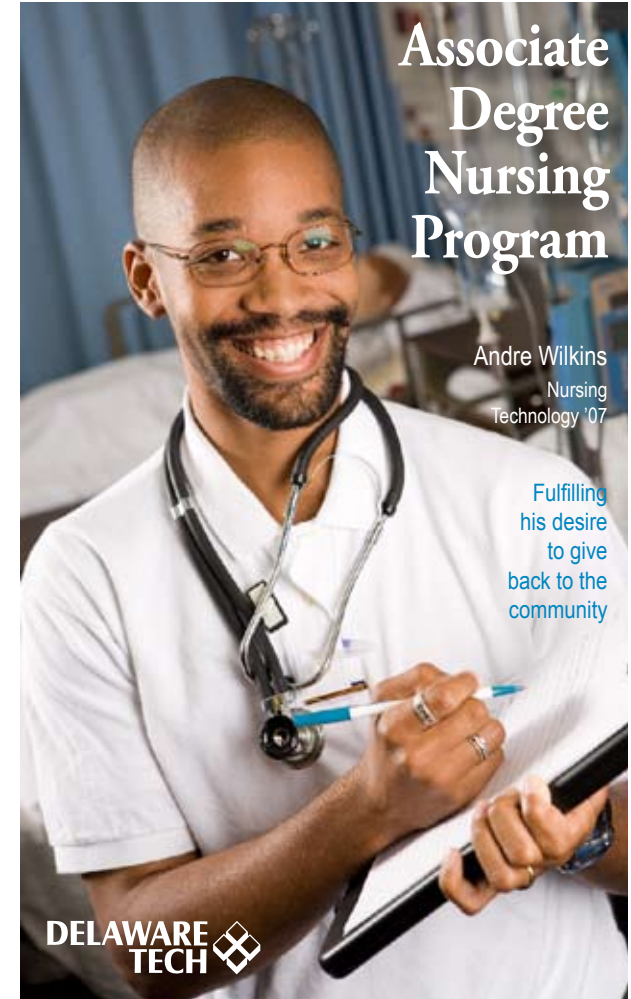

Some Facts to Consider

- ❖ Nursing is projected to be one of the fastest growing occupations by the Department of Labor.
- ❖ Median annual earnings in 2007 for registered nurses nationally were \$59,859.
- ❖ A nursing career offers job security, flexibility, and one of the highest starting salaries in the healthcare industry.
- ❖ Registered nurses can work in a variety of areas including pediatrics, emergency/trauma care, mental health, medical-surgical, critical care, maternity/newborn, and oncology.
- ❖ There are over 101 careers in nursing, and many employers will help pay for advanced education or certification.
- ❖ Our graduates pass the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses at rates consistently above the national and state averages. In 2007, the national average was 85 percent for first-time test-takers. Delaware's average was 81, and Delaware Tech-Stanton campus pass rate was 86.9 percent.



- ❖ The job placement rate within six months of graduation for our nursing students was 97 percent in 2008.
- ❖ The Associate Degree Nursing Program at Delaware Tech is nationally accredited by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC), and is approved by the Delaware Board of Nursing.
- ❖ Delaware Tech's nursing program is the most affordable in the state.

The Curriculum

Our nursing program provides students with a balance of general education, science and social science courses, as well as nursing courses with required supervised clinical experiences that prepare our graduates for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN).

General education courses are offered during the day and evening in the fall, spring and summer. Nursing courses are offered during the day in the fall and spring, with limited late afternoon and evening options. The clinical component of the Associate Degree Nursing Program is designed to be completed in four semesters of full-time study; however, part-time study options are available.

Eligible prospective nursing students must take the National League for Nursing (NLN) Pre-admission Exam and apply for a seat in the nursing program. To provide prospective students with important information about the admission process, Nursing Information Sessions are offered monthly at the Stanton campus.

Learn from the best!

Our full-time nursing instructors are highly qualified and have master's degrees in their specialty areas. Full-time faculty members have both classroom and clinical teaching responsibilities. This means that the same instructors who teach in the classroom will be present with students in the hospital and other clinical settings. Nursing faculty members are responsive and supportive, and many instructors have years of experience helping nursing students gain the knowledge, skills and confidence needed to succeed.



Delaware Tech's nursing program even offers our students *free* tutoring through our Supplemental Instruction Program in Nursing (SIP-N). Practicing RNs work with our nursing students to provide supplemental instruction for each nursing course; thereby, allowing students to get the extra help that they may need to be successful.
