

The following policy is effective as of May 1, 2008:

- Transfer credit for equivalent college science classes will be granted for a "C" or better within 5 years of the semester during which the grade was received.
- College credit for an AP (Advanced Placement) exam for the equivalent college science class will be granted for a grade of 3 or higher within 5 years of the semester during which the grade was received.
- College credit for a CLEP exam for the equivalent college science class will be granted for a grade of 50 or higher within 5 years of the semester during which the grade was received.

Transfer credit for college courses over 5 years old will be considered under the following circumstances:

- If the student completed a degree in science or a science-related field (for ex. a practicing chiropractor could receive credit for Anatomy & Physiology)
- If the student produces documentation demonstrating that s/he uses scientific information in his/her area of employment (for ex. a high school chemistry teacher could receive transfer credit for chemistry).
- If the course is over 5 years old, the student is welcome to take a test-out exam for the course. The exam is administered by the Biology & Chemistry department. DTCC credit will be granted for the course if the student passes the test-out for the course with a grade of 75% or higher.
