Parking Policy/Regulations

(Stanton/Wilmington)

Parking:

All vehicles parked in College lots and/or garages must be properly registered and display a current Delaware Tech. parking permit tag. All vehicles operated and /or parked on College property must be properly registered and display a current state motor vehicle license plate. Visitors shall report to the Campus Public Safety Office, or other designated location, and provide vehicle information.

Vehicles that park without a parking permit tag are subject to warning tickets and repeat offenders will be towed at the owner's expense. In addition, any expenses incurred by the college must be reimbursed to the College.

Parking is provided as a service to the students and staff without liability for damage or loss incurred. The issuance of a parking permit tag does not guarantee the availability of a parking space. Car-pooling, and the use of public transportation is encouraged. Handicapped parking areas are provided and designated by signage.

Use of College parking lots and/or garages during unauthorized hours (11p.m. – 7a.m.) is prohibited. No motor vehicle shall be left in a parking after hours without notification and permission of the Campus Public Safety Department.

Parking Regulations:

Please –

1. Do not park in a lot or garage without a valid DTCC parking permit tag. Permits may be restricted for use during a specific time frame and operators are limited to parking only during those hours.

2. Do not block or park in designated fire lanes (indicated by signage or yellow markings). Violators may be towed and/or cited.

3. Do not park in areas where other vehicles may be blocked or traffic is impeded.

4. Do not park on the grass or ball fields unless directed to by a uniform Public Safety Officer.

5. Do not occupy more than one parking space. Oversized vehicles such as buses, school buses, tractor trailers, recreational vehicles and other similar vehicles are prohibited from parking on campus without the express permission of the Campus Director and/or the Campus Public Safety Chief.

6. Do not park in handicapped spaces without a current handicapped parking permit from the State Department of Motor Vehicles. (Violators will be towed at owner's expense and/or cited.)

7. Do not exceed the designated speed limit. After three (3) violations, suspension of parking privileges and/or towing may result.

8. Do not park in reserved or visitor's spaces, loading areas, staff/faculty lots, areas designated "no parking", spaces blocked off with traffic cones or those marked in yellow stripping. (Violators may be towed and/or cited.)

9. Do park motorcycles and bicycles in designated parking areas (where provided). These vehicles are prohibited from being parked on sidewalks, or inside any College building or other facility.

10) Do not operate and/or park any other pedestrian conveyance, i.e. skate boards, horse drawn carriages, scooters, etc., without the express permission of the Campus Director and/or the Campus Chief of Public Safety.

11) Violations of the parking policy may be referred to the Dean of Students, or the Campus Director's Office, for remediation or administrative sanctions. Parking privileges are subject to revocation for violations of this policy.
