Terry Campus invites the public to celebrate Black History Month

DOVER- The public is welcome to attend a variety of events to celebrate Black History Month during the month of February at the Delaware Technical & Community College, Terry Campus.

Representative Donald Blakey and his wife Dolores Blakey will present an image of slavery in Delaware during “Dinah, Life on the Neck: circa 1780” on Monday, Feb. 11 from 12 to 1 p.m. in the Educational Technology Building Conference Center.

Drs. Berlin and Reba Hollingsworth will present “Growing Up in Delaware (1920’s to the Present)” on Tuesday, Feb. 12 from 12 to 1 p.m. in the Terry Building, room 215. They will combine culture and history to provide a unique observation about personal experiences growing up as Black people in Delaware.

On Wednesday, Feb. 27 from 12-12:30 p.m. in Downes Lecture Hall, the Terry Singers will perform songs reflecting melodies and history of the slave era.

To conclude the month’s festivities, attendees may listen to the sounds of Black History during “Every Tone a Testimony” in Downes Lecture Hall on Thursday, Feb. 28 from 5-7:30 p.m. This audio presentation creates a history of African American culture by including oral and literary traditions with dynamic music. The compact disc, a collection
