DOVER - Delaware Tech's Upward Bound program held its annual TRIO Day Celebration on Saturday, Feb. 23. Nine Upward Bound alumni came back for this year's TRIO Day to share their experiences and offer tips and advice to current Upward Bound students and parents.

Upward Bound is one of the programs under "TRIO," an initiative that was begun as part of President Lyndon B. Johnson's War on Poverty.
